	Then Jesus saith unto them, Children, have ye any meat? They answered him, No.	Then <b>Yeshua</b> said to them, "Children, do you have something to eat?" So they answered, "No."
	And he said unto them, Cast the net on the right side of the ship, and ye shall find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes.	Then he said to them, "Cast <sup>4</sup> the nets <b>further on</b> , <sup>5</sup> and you will find." When they cast <sup>6</sup> the nets in the water, a great multitude of fish entered into them, so they were not able to pull <i>them</i> out.
	Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt his fisher's coat unto him, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea.	Then that talmid who was loved by Yeshua, said to Keipha, "It is <b>Ha-Adon</b> !" Then Shimon Keipha, when he heard <i>that</i> it was <b>Ha-Adon</b> , clothed himself with his clothes – for he was unclothed <sup>7</sup> – and went into the sea.

	He saith to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my sheep. (Now Keipha was <b>anxious</b> because he had asked him <b>three times</b> if he loved him.) He said to him, " <b>Adon</b> knowing all things, you know that I love you!" So <b>Yeshua</b> said to him, "Feed my <b>flock</b> .
	Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdest thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry thee whither thou wouldest not.	Truth I say to you — when I was a young man <sup>1</sup> you were staying and going to the place of your pleasure, but when you become an elder you will stretch out your hand and another will go after you and drive you into a place that you do not find pleasure in."
	This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.	(And <b>Yeshua</b> said [this], <b>alluding</b> <sup>1</sup> with what death <i>he</i> would glorify <b>El</b> .) And when he had said this, he said to Keipha, " <b>Come after</b> me!"
	Then Peter, turning about, seeth the disciple whom Jesus loved following; which also leaned on his breast at supper, and said, Lord, which is he that betrayeth thee?	Then Keipha turned himself back, and saw that talmid whom Yeshua loved exceedingly, going after $him - he$ who reclined on his chest at the meal.
	Peter seeing him saith to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do?	So when Keipha saw this, he asked <b>Yeshua</b> , "What will become of this man?"
	Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? follow thou me.	So Yeshua said unto him, "I want that he abides here until I will come – what is it to you? You, come after me!"
	Then went this saying abroad among the brethren, that that disciple should not die: yet Jesus said not unto him, He shall not die; but, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee?	Therefore this word went out among his brothers that this talmid would not die; but he <i>only</i> said "I want that he abides here until I will come – what is it to you?"
