1	For the Lamb which is in the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of waters: and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes.	And when he opened the seventh, everyone in the heavens was silent for a moment,
2	And I saw the seven angels which stood before God; and to them were given seven trumpets.	and I saw seven messengers coming before YHWH , and seven shopharot ¹ were given to them.
3	And another angel came and stood at the altar, having a golden censer; and there was given unto him much incense, that he should offer it with the prayers of all saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne.	And another messenger came and stepped ² next to the temple , and golden fire pans were in his hand . And much incense was given to him, to give <i>it</i> as the prayer of the setapart ones, before the temple, and ³ before the throne.
