

## Muhammad and the Millennial Kingdom

AH-HA! Is how I wanted to begin this deliberation, but alas, **Muhammad**'s mile-marker on the <u>Timeline</u>, as well as his activity within the confines of the Millennial Kingdom of Yahusha HaMashiach, is more of a *hmmmmm* at the moment. If you have doubts about the revelation We have sent down to Our servant, then produce a single sura like it—enlist whatever supporters you have other than Allah—if you truly [think you can]. If you cannot do this—and you never will—then beware of the Fire prepared for the disbelievers, whose fuel is men and stones. But if you do not—and you will never be able to—then fear the Fire, whose fuel is men and stones, prepared for the disbelievers.

We're only three pages in and the message is straightforward. Believe the message of the Prophet or go to Hell. All disbelievers are fuel for the fire. Worship Allah or you'll be sorry. Hell awaits. Passages such as what I have just given you go on and on and on and on to the point of shell shock. After having combed through the Quran, can you blame me for suspecting these are the rants of an MK-Ultra victim? For added clarification, what am I supposed to believe again, so as to avoid Hell? It's already been laid out. Telling you to worship Allah alone is the same thing as saying stop worshiping Yahusha HaMashiach, King of Kings and Lord of lords. Yup, I've just cracked the code. That's the Quran in a nutshell.

The writer of the Quran had quite the challenge before him. On one hand, he couldn't outright reject the Torah and the Wisdom given to Yashar'el, as well as the great kingdom which had visibly manifested in its wake. Why deny the obvious reality around him? Another locale which Muhammad made frequent use of was the Garden of Paradise, a destination for the godeshiym of Yashar'el. That's a reference to the Blessed Land, detailed in my other book, The Hidden Wilderness. What Muhammad needed is for the residents of that said kingdom to reject their citizenship, thereby entering the Garden by another route. To do so, a fork in the road was offered. offspring. <sup>89</sup> How terrible is this thing you assert: <sup>90</sup> it almost causes the heavens to be torn apart, the earth to split asunder, the mountains to crumble to pieces, <sup>91</sup> that they attribute offspring to the Lord of Mercy. <sup>92</sup> It does not befit the Lord of Mercy [to have offspring]: <sup>93</sup> there is no one in the heavens or earth who will not come to the Lord of Mercy as a servant. <sup>94</sup> He has counted them all: He has numbered them exactly <sup>95</sup> and

they will each return to Him on the Day of Resurrection all alone.

According to the Prophet of Allah, only a disbeliever would say Yahusha HaMashiach was the Son of Alahayam. By the way, I'm not triggered. People get into a hissy fit because the Quran straight up says that Yahusha is not the Son of Alahayam without understanding the greater argument. To the writer of the Quran, there is no heavenly Father. No, Allah may be the Creator of heaven and earth, but the relationship between Allah and men is that he is Lord and men are his servants. Not even the angels regard him as father. There are no adoptions, no intimacy to be had. Therefore, to have a prophet like Yahusha claim a heavenly Father is ludicrous. That's not what I'm claiming, mind you. Some people have short attention spans. The present conversation revolves around the claims of the Quran regarding Yahusha, the Son of Alahayam. Well, here is what Scripture has to say on the issue of fatherhood.

<sup>8</sup> But now, O YAHAUAHA, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; and we all are the work of your hand.

Yesha'yahu (Isaiah) 44:8

Seems pretty straightforward if you want my opinion on the matter. Can't get any clearer than that. YAHAUAHA was the Father of Yashar'el, implying any number of sons. Muhammed didn't like that. And so, returning again to the Quran, here is what else we read.

No person to whom Allah had given the Scripture, wisdom, and prophethood would ever say to people, 'Be my servants, not Allah's.' He would say, 'You should be devoted to Allah because you have taught the

Scripture and studied it closely.' <sup>80</sup> He would never command you to take angels and prophets as lords. How could he command you to be disbelievers after you had devoted yourselves to Allah?

You see, already we're being repetitive, and in only a few short passages. I personally found the Quran to be a copy and paste affair, albeit this particular passage resides on the passive aggressive side of the aggressor scale. Stop worshiping Yahusha HaMashiach because Allah is not anyone's father. Should you persist, then you're a disbeliever on the highway to Hell. If only Islam would take Muhammed's advice and treat Muhammed as a messenger rather than Lord, but I digress. Meanwhile, we shan't forget the words of the Son of ALAHAYAM when he said:

All things are delivered unto me of my Father: and no man knows the Son, but the Father; neither knows any man the Father, save the Son, and he to whomever the Son will reveal him.

Besorah Mattithyahu (Matthew) 11:17

Is it even possible to get more straightforward than that? No man knows the Father in heaven save the Son and also those whom the Son will reveal. Sounds to me like the Son didn't reveal the Father to the Prophet, *oops*. I'm detecting a spirit of jealousy from the Prophet. To quote Muhammed, "You should be devoted to Allah because you have taught the Scripture and studied it closely." Well then, either Muhammed hasn't read the Scripture or he's intending an audience that hasn't read it for themselves.

Here, let me sum up the Quran for you again. The Quran was war propaganda aimed at brainwashing the normies, ultimately pulling citizens out of a covenant relationship with YAHAUAHA, which was furthermore renewed through Yahusha HaMashiach during the fig tree generation. They will cry, 'This is terrible torment!' <sup>12</sup> Lord relieve us from this torment! We believe!' <sup>13</sup> How will this sudden faith benefit them? When a prophet came to warn them plainly, <sup>14</sup> they turned their backs on him, saying, 'He is tutored! He is possessed! <sup>15</sup> We shall hold the torment back for a while—you are sure to return to Us. <sup>16</sup> And on the Day We seize them mightily We shall exact retribution.

## Quran, Smoke 10-16

Really, I should have started out with this one. So good. Supposing you haven't gotten around to reading my report on 536: Year of the Fire Reset, and I keep asking you to, then you're probably already lost. The rest of you have done your homework and should be falling out of your chair right about now, as I did. The footnote at the bottom of my Quran claims that some Scholars have interpreted this passage to indicate an actual event which Muhammad experienced within his lifetime. I take that to mean I wouldn't be the first to suggest the obvious. 536 is being described. In the very least, The Apocalypse was rehearsed to the writer by someone who managed the experience.

Considering all this impending Fire talk, the Prophet very likely may have been writing to an audience with the aim of making them forget about what had already occurred a generation or two earlier, maybe even their own. Believe me when I say rewriting His-Story in real time is a perfectly achievable goal. The Mandela Effect has taught me that.

To understand what I'm getting at, you will need to recall a discussion we had some years ago regarding the Bolshevik Revolution. Ask any historian and they will readily admit, when faced with the reality of the **Soviet Union**, the rewriting of history became a recognized institution during the **20th century**. Given absolute control over the literature as well as the Media, the memories of hundreds of millions of people were rewired.

Soon after Stalin achieved power, rival Leon Trotsky, founder of the Red Army and a monumental force behind the Bolshevik Revolution, simply disappeared from the public eye. You can see him in the provided picture. He's standing directly under the soap box which Vladimir Lenin is preaching from, kind of like a 'Where's Waldo?'. What happened to Trotsky? Thanks for asking. He was assassinated in 1940, ice ax to the brain. Immediately afterwards, every portrait that had once hung in public squares and private households. Trotsky was erased from public consciousness. For the everyday Labour Party Soviet, Stalin and Lenin were inserted into the very role which Trotsky had once held, standing together as the imperial leaders of the

Bolshevik. One might think wiping away the existence of a nationwide public figure would be a conspiracy too large to pull off. And yet it happened. History was re-written. Every Media outlet east of Berlin apparently had a part to play in the propaganda. Educators facilitated it. Museums played their part. Even the postage stamp people were in on the conspiracy.

While younger generations of Soviets believed this illegitimate distortion of the historical records was a true linear portrayal of political events, and likely saw little to no reason to question it, older generations, who had once personally familiarized themselves with the works and portraits of Trotsky in real time, notably struggled with falsememory syndromes. A false memory syndrome, in case you were unaware, is the experience of seeming to remember events that never actually occurred in the official narrative. There is the Mandela Effect for you.

Everyone's favorite Establishment spook, George Orwell, took notice of the Stalin Playbook. He later wrote something to the effect:


"The most effective way to destroy people is to deny and obliterate their own understanding of their history."



Another problem was the true Christians in North Africa who preached the gospel. Roman Catholicism was growing in power but would not tolerate opposition. Somehow the Vatican had to create a weapon to eliminate both the Jews and the true Christian believers who refused to accept Roman Catholicism. Looking to North Africa, they saw the multitudes of Arabs as a source of manpower to do their dirty work. Some Arabs had become Roman

Catholic and could be used in reporting information to leaders in Rome. Others were used in an underground spy network to carry out Rome's master plan to control the great multitudes of Arabs who rejected Catholicism. When St Augustine appeared on the scene, he knew what was going on. His monasteries served as bases to seek out and destroy Bible manuscripts owned by the true Christians.

Dang. I knew Augustine was a spook and that there was a smoking gun poking out from underneath his Alb, but this barrel is loaded. The RCC hosted an underground spy network via Augustine's monasteries. His missionary journeys in Brittain are finally making a whole lot more sense if they haven't already. Rivera even has Augustine destroying Bible manuscripts owned by the true Christians. That's a reference to the Natsarim. The Vatican wanted to create a messiah for the Arabs, someone they could raise up as a great leader, a man with charisma whom they could train, and eventually unite all the non-Catholic Arabs behind him, creating a mighty army that would ultimately capture Jerusalem for the pope. In the Vatican briefing, Cardinal Bea told us this story: 'A wealthy Arabian lady who was a faithful follower of the pope played a tremendous part in this drama. She was a widow named Khadijah. She gave her wealth to the church and retired to a convent as a nun but was

given an assignment. She was to find a brilliant young man who could be used by the Vatican to create a new religion and become the messiah for the children of Ishmael. Khadijah had a cousin named Waraquah, who was also a very faithful Roman Catholic, and the Vatican placed him in a critical role as Muhammad's advisor. He had tremendous influence on Muhammad.

The Vatican needed an Islam army to capture Jerusalem but why not do it themselves? It's not like the official narrative deprives the Pope of fighting men. I'm not saying there wasn't a bloody conflict in Jerusalem during the Kingdom of Mashiach, via 'the Crusades', but my investigation has led me to conclude that Yahuda was purposely underdeveloped by the sons of Yashar'el during the Thousand-Years, as Revelation 18:2 states. Rivera didn't have full disclosure and I don't hold it against him. I could very well see a financed fighting force against Mashiach though. What better way to do that than create a second Messiah for the Arabs?

That's where **Khadijah bint Khuwaylid** steps onto the stage. 'The Mother of Islam' was a wealthy **40-year-old** widow when she married the **25-year-old** Muhammad. She initially brought Muhammad on as an employee three years earlier in order that he might manage her affairs. But then Rivera clarifies, she had already given her wealth to the RCC and retired to one of Augustine's world-famous monasteries. Muhammad was her assignment. Interesting to note, it was not Muhammad that proposed to Khadija, but Khadija to Muhammad. Way to rock the cradle, Khadija. In other news, history records that she became the first woman Muslim while simultaneously overlooking the obvious, she was his handler.

Muhammad began receiving 'divine revelations', and his wife's Catholic cousin Waraquah helped interpret them.

Waraqah ibn Nawfal is another fascinating character, not simply due to his relations with Khadijah or because he played the part of his other handler, helping Muhammad to interpret his visions, *wink-wink*. Rivera claims he was a Roman spook. Did I not tell you that the Quran comes across like the rants and ravings of an MK-Ultra victim? Jonah 94

The Quran has Allah telling the Prophet to go to the people of the Book and ask them how to interpret it. Because ask any former Catholic, reading the Bible for oneself is dangerous business. That quote really stood out to me during my Quran binge reading session. Many will interpret that passage to mean Muhammad was expected to interview Christians and Jews about Scripture but that's not how I take it at all. The people whom Allah assigned as Muhammad's fact-checkers were likely Khadijah ad Waraquah.

Well, get this then. I *checked*, Waraquah was an **Ebionite priest**. Um, are you remotely aware of who the Ebionites were? The Ebionites followed the Torah of YAHAUAHA while proclaiming Yahusha as Mashiach. Many of them rejected the teachings of Pa'al as well, holding strictly to vegetarian diets. Are you having the same troubles with this passage as I am having? It doesn't line up with other assertions made by Muhammad. Not seeing

it? I think I know what's happening. I neglected to give you Satan's origin story, according to the Prophet. Get ready for a contradiction because I'm about to give it.

When we told the angels, 'bow down before Adam,' they all bowed. But not Iblis, who refused and was arrogant: he was disobedient. 35 We said, 'Adam, live with your wife in this garden. Both of you eat freely there as you will, but do not go near this tree, or you will both become wrongdoers.' 36 But Satan made them slip, and removed them from the state they were in.

The Cow: 34-36

It says here that **Iblis**, the Serpent in this story, refused to bow down before A'dam. But then, if I'm reading Muhammad's dissertation right, why should he? I thought we were supposed to have no lord but Allah. Iblis was simply taking Muhammad's advice, or vice versa. Satan was showing strength and resilience of character in refusing to give in to the peer pressure and bow down with the crowd, wanting only to worship Allah alone, and how did Allah repay him? By villainizing Iblis, casting him down out of heaven, whereas he apparently honored Muhammad for the same task.

<sup>59</sup> In Allah's eyes [Yahusha] is just like Adam: He created him from dust, then He said to him: "Bel' and he was. <sup>60</sup> This is the truth from your Lord, so do not be one of those who doubt.

Call me a westerner or an infidel or whatever, but I'm not following the logic. Muhammad is straight up recognizing Yahusha HaMashiach as a second A'dam, which is great and all. I mean, doesn't Pa'al do the same in Romans 5:12-21; 1 Corinthians 15:22, 44-49; and Ephesians 1:10? He *does*. And so, it just seems to me that Iblis would also refuse to bow down before Yahusha, the second A'dam, seeing as how he's a die-hard worshiper of Allah and all. Consistency is key.
