
Being a believer in the modern world

Black Lives Matter and the question of racism

In South Africa where I'm from, one of the biggest issues that has plagued our country for decades now is racism. There is the issue of Apartheid, the segregation of black and coloured people. The country seemed to have broken free from the stronghold of racism once apartheid was abolished but not so. We entered into the era of Affirmative Action and Black Economic Empowerment. The young black people of my generation and younger, who have never experienced the segregation and hardships of Apartheid blame white people for their own "oppression", causing whites to lose jobs and other opportunities – this has been happening since the early 2000s!

I see that this pattern is happening now in the US as well as in other countries in the world – the white people being under attack from "reverse racism", in other words white people being made out to be the evil enemy who have always and are still oppressing people of colour. Let's have a look at how this is playing out now:

"Black Lives Matter (BLM) is a decentralized political and social movement that seeks to highlight racism, discrimination, and racial inequality experienced by black people, and promote anti-racism. Its primary concerns are incidents of police brutality and racially motivated violence against black people. It started following the killings of Trayvon Martin, Michael Brown, Eric Garner, and Rekia Boyd, among others. The movement and its related organizations typically advocate for various policy changes considered to be related to black liberation. While there are specific organizations that label themselves simply as "Black Lives Matter," such as the Black Lives Matter Global Network, the overall movement is a decentralized network of people and organizations with no formal hierarchy. The slogan "Black Lives Matter" itself remains untrademarked by any group. Despite being characterized by some as a violent movement, the <u>overwhelming majority of its public demonstrations have been</u> <u>peaceful</u>.

The movement began in July 2013, with the use of the hashtag #BlackLivesMatter on social media after the acquittal of George Zimmerman in the shooting death of African-American teen Trayvon Martin 17 months earlier in February 2012. It became nationally recognized for street demonstrations following the 2014 deaths of two more African Americans, Michael Brown resulting in protests and unrest in Ferguson, Missouri, a city near St. Louis and Eric Garner in New York City. Since the Ferguson protests, participants in the movement have demonstrated against the deaths of numerous other African Americans by police actions or while in police custody. In the summer of 2015, Black Lives Matter activists became involved in the 2016 United States presidential election. The originators of the hashtag and call to action, Alicia Garza, Patrisse Cullors, and Opal Tometi, expanded their project into a national network of over 30 local chapters between 2014 and 2016.

The movement returned to national headlines and gained further international attention during the global George Floyd protests in 2020 following his murder by Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin. An estimated 15 million to 26 million people participated in the 2020 Black Lives Matter protests in the United States, making it one of the largest movements in the country's history. It comprised many views and a broad array of demands but they centered on criminal justice reform."

"Critical race theory (CRT) is an interdisciplinary academic field devoted to analyzing how laws, social and political movements, and media shape, and are shaped by, social conceptions of race and ethnicity. CRT also considers racism to be systemic in various laws and rules, and not only based on individuals' prejudices. The word critical in the name is an academic reference to critical thinking, critical theory, and scholarly criticism, rather than criticizing or blaming individuals.

CRT is also used in sociology to explain social, political, and legal structures and power distribution as through a "lens" focusing on the concept of race, and experiences of racism. For example, the CRT conceptual framework examines racial bias in laws and legal institutions, such as highly disparate rates of incarceration among racial groups in the United States. A key CRT concept is intersectionality-the way in which different forms of inequality and identity are affected by interconnections of race, class, gender, and disability. Scholars of CRT view race as a social construct with no biological basis. One tenet of CRT is that racism and disparate racial outcomes are the result of complex, changing, and often subtle social and institutional dynamics, rather than explicit and intentional prejudices of individuals. CRT scholars argue that the social and legal construction of race advances the interests of white people at the expense of people of color, and that the liberal notion of U.S. law as "neutral" plays a significant role in maintaining a racially unjust social order, where formally color-blind laws continue to have racially discriminatory outcomes."

Critical race theory is being taught in many schools and colleges across the US. Racism does occur everywhere! But it goes in all directions, towards all races from all races. But racism is definitely not a Biblical concept! It's time to turn away from what the world says about race and take a look at Scripture to see what YAHUAH says about this:

"For YAHUAH your Elohim is Elohim of mighty ones and Master of masters, the great Ěl, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality nor takes a bribe. He executes right-ruling for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the stranger, giving him food and a garment. And you shall love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Mitsrayim." Deuteronomy 10:17-35

The Most High "shows no partiality", He does not prefer one over another, and everyone is human and His child in His eyes. We are to look after our brothers and sisters in faith as well as the strangers, or sojourners, among us. We are to "love our neighbour" which means we should also not show partiality – we should love all those around us, not thinking of skin colour, race or social and financial standing.

Do not judge according to appearance, but judge with righteous judgment. John 7:24

The apostle John tells us that we cannot judge people by their appearance, and this includes skin colour.

And opening his mouth, Kĕpha said, "Truly I see that Elohim shows no partiality, but in every nation, he who fears Him and works righteousness is accepted by Him." Acts 10:34-35

"Do not fear, for I am with you. Do not look around, for I am your Elohim. I shall fortify you, I shall also help you, I shall also uphold you with the right hand of My righteousness." Isaiah 41:10

When I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil. For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me. Psalm 23:4

YAHUAH is my light and my deliverance; Whom should I fear? YAHUAH is the refuge of my life; Whom should I dread? Psalm 27:1

I sought YAHUAH, and He answered me, And delivered me from all my fears. Psalm 34:4

In the day I am afraid, I trust in You. Psalm 56:3

The fear of man brings a snare, but whoever trusts in YAHUAH is set on high. Proverbs 29:25

Do not worry at all, but in every matter, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to Elohim. And the peace of Elohim, which surpasses all understanding, shall guard your hearts and minds through Messiah Yahusha. Philippians 4:6-7

For Elohim has not given us a spirit of cowardice, but of power and of love and of self-control. 2 Timothy 1:7

Let your way of life be without the love of silver, and be satisfied with what you have. For He Himself has said, "I shall never leave you nor forsake you," so that we boldly say, "YAHUAH is my helper, I shall not fear what man shall do to me." Hebrews 13:5-6

There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear, because fear holds punishment, and he who fears has not been made perfect in love. 1 John 4:18

But even if you suffer for righteousness' sake, you are blessed. "And do not fear their threats, neither be troubled." 1 Peter 3:14

Humble yourselves, then, under the mighty hand of Elohim, so that He exalts you in due time, casting all your worry upon Him, for He is concerned about you. 1 Peter 5:6-7

The Word tells us ever so many times that we are not to be afraid of others or events, that YAHUAH is our provider and our protector, that whatever happens we belong to Him. He tells us so many times, that we should fear Him alone, that He is above that which is of the world!

And coming back to the subject of the homophobia, transphobia, fatphobia, Islamophobia, etc, it is ridiculous to think that people who disagree with these beliefs and lifestyles are afraid of them! The fact that we believe these to be sinful and wrong does not make us afraid, and we should not be led to believe otherwise.

Public School, College and University

My son, do not forget my Torah, And let your heart watch over my commands; for length of days and long life And peace they add to you. Proverbs 3:1-2

Train up a child in the way he should go, even when he is old he turns not away from it. Proverbs 22:6

Proverbs make it clear, Scripture should be our first tool in instructing our children.

Thus said YAHUAH, your Redeemer, the Set-apart One of Yisra'ěl, "I am YAHUAH your Elohim, teaching you what is best, leading you by the way you should go." Isaiah 48:17

YAHUAH's instructions in Scripture is our base of knowledge, and His Ruach gives us the wisdom we need in life. The Most High will lead us through life if only we learn and follow His ways.

And Yahusha came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Rather, love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting none in return. And your reward shall be great, and you shall be sons of the Most High. Because He is kind to the thankless and wicked ones. Luke 6:35

Therefore, as chosen ones of Elohim, set-apart and beloved, put on compassion, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, patience, bearing with one another, and forgiving each other if anyone has a complaint against another, indeed, as Messiah forgave you so also should you. Colossians 3:12-13

The question of speaking the Truth

To further answer the question of speaking the Truth to others in love and kindness, why should we even do so when the modern church sees fit to accept all sorts of sinful lifestyles all in the guise of being "loving", even actively promoting these lifestyles and ideas?

"Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the house of Yisra'ĕl. And you shall hear a word from My mouth, and shall warn them from Me. When I say to the wrong, 'You shall certainly die,' and you have not warned him, nor spoken to warn the wrong from his wrong way, to save his life, that same wrong man shall die in his crookedness, and his blood I require at your hand. But if you have warned the wrong and he does not turn from his wrong, nor from his wrong way, he shall die in his crookedness, and you have delivered your being. And when a righteous one turns from his righteousness and shall do unrighteousness, when I have put a stumbling-block before him, he shall die. Because you did not warn him, he shall die in his sin, and his righteousness which he has done is not remembered, and his blood I require at your hand. But if you have warned the righteous one that the righteous should not sin, and he did not sin, he shall certainly live because he has been warned, and you have delivered your being." Ezekiel 3:17-21

The warning given to Ezekiel is dire! If we see another sinning, whether a stranger or a brother or sister faltering, we have to speak up otherwise their sin, their blood, is on our hands! Can I add 10 more explanation marks? Make the text bold? Highlight it in red and capitalize?

As Natzarines, or Watchers, of Yashar'el, we need to do this to keep our own hands clean and to follow this command of the Most High!

"But, maintaining the truth in love, we grow up in all respects into Him who is the head, Messiah," Ephesians 4:15
