

Pork Is *Still* an Abomination: Kepha's Vision *Finally* Explained

<sup>44</sup> For the king had sent cepheriym by messengers unto Yerushalayim and the cities of Yahud that they should

follow the strange laws of the land, <sup>45</sup> And forbid ascending smoke offerings, and sacrifice, and drink offerings, in the Temple; and that they should profane the Shabbaths and feast days: <sup>46</sup> And pollute the sanctuary and holy people: <sup>47</sup> Set up altars, and Asherah poles, and chapels of idols, and sacrifice swine's flesh, and unclean beasts: <sup>48</sup> That they should also leave their children uncircumcised, and make their souls abominable with all manner of uncleanness and profanation: <sup>49</sup> To the end they might forget the Torah, and change all the ordinances.

Makkabiym Ri'shon (1 Maccabees) 1:44-49 [Cepher]

You will tell me that's not Kepha's vision and that I'm already stalling, which is apparently a habit of mine. I'm just pointing out the reported fact that, if the Antichrist were to incite the abomination of desolation all over again, baby back ribs would apparently be on the menu and therefore not a part of the problem. Cleanse the Temple but keep the coals glowing out back, did I get that right? Yeah, I'm sure the ham hock and the other unclean beasts had nothing to do with it. Shrimp and oysters, probably. <sup>24</sup> And the Lord said, Let the soil of the earth bring forth the living creature according to his kind; the kind that is clean and the kind that is unclean; cattle, and creeping thing, and the creature of the earth, according to his kind. And it was so.

## Bere'shiyth (Genesis) 1:24 [Aramaic Targum]

It truly is difficult journeying back any further into His-Story than that, seeing as how we've landed upon the fifth day of the creation week. And as you can clearly see, clean and unclean animals were identified, telling us that catfish weren't metamorphosized into bottom feeders at Sinai, as many suspect. Just this very moment, you frantically flipped through the pages of your Bible and didn't read anything regarding clean or unclean animals on the fifth day of creation. That may be. The Aramaic Targum is an ancient translation, far older than the Hebrew Masoretic, and I am simply making a point to show that the transcribers knew the *obvious* when they stumbled upon it, which is precisely what "according to his kind" directs our attention to. <sup>9</sup> On the morrow, as they went on their journey, and drew nigh unto the city, Kepha went up upon the housetop to pray about the sixth hour: <sup>10</sup> And he became very hungry, and would have eaten: but while they made ready, he fell into a trance, <sup>11</sup> And saw heaven opened, and a certain vessel descending upon him, as it had been a great sheet knit at the four corners, and let down to the earth: <sup>12</sup> Wherein were all manner of four-footed beasts of the earth, and wild beasts, and creeping things, and fowls of the air. <sup>13</sup> And there came a voice to him, Rise, Kepha; kill, and eat. <sup>14</sup> But Kepha said, Not so, Adonai; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean. <sup>15</sup> And

the voice spoke unto him again the second time, What Elohiym hath cleansed, that call not thou common. 

This was done thrice: and the vessel was received up again into heaven. 

Now while Kepha doubted in himself what this vision which he had seen should mean, behold, the men, which were sent from Qurnelius had made enquiry for Shim'on's house, and stood before the gate, 

And called, and asked whether Shim'on, which was surnamed Kepha, were lodged there.

Ma'asiym (Acts) 10:9-18

Oh no. It's happened. The entirety of Scripture has been defeated. By a single vision. Kepha saw a host of animals on a sheet, telling us that Yahuah has changed his mind about the whole abomination thing, as found in Leviticus 11:7. All those people who kept their bodies pure, because Yahuah told them the alternative was abominable, and for what, exactly? So that Kepha could take a trip to the all-you-can-eat buffet? Vultures and pelicans, salamanders and horses and gorillas as well as puppies and kittens are finally on the menu. Who says the gospel can't taste good? *Continuing*.

<sup>19</sup>While **Kepha thought on the vision**, the Ruach said unto him, Behold, **three men** seek thee. <sup>20</sup> Arise therefore, and get thee down, and go with them, doubting nothing: for I have sent them.

Ma'asiym (Acts) 10:19-20

Hmmm, I wonder if the **three men** have anything to do with the **three visions**. It's almost too convenient, how Kepha is still chewing on the meaning of his *thrice* repeated vision and then three men arrive on schedule, but who am I to declare its meaning? Best to let Kepha interpret the dream for us. Let's keep reading.

<sup>21</sup>Then Kepha went down to the men which were sent unto him from Qurnelius; and said, Behold, I am he, whom ye seek: what is the cause wherefore ye are come? <sup>22</sup>And they said, Qurnelius the centurion, a just man, and one that fears Elohiym, and of good report among all the nation of the Yahudiym, was warned from Elohiym by a holy angel to send for thee into his house, and to hear words of thee. <sup>23</sup>Then called he them in and lodged them.

And on the morrow Kepha went away with them, and certain brethren from Yapho (Joppa) accompanied him. <sup>24</sup> And the morrow after they entered into Qeycaryah (Caesarea). And Qurnelius waited for them, and he had called together his kinsmen and near friends. <sup>25</sup> And as Kepha was coming in, Qurnelius met him, and fell down at his feet, and worshipped him. <sup>26</sup> But Kepha took him up, saying, Stand up; I myself also am a man. <sup>27</sup> And as he talked with him, he went in, and found many that were come together.

Ma'asiym (Acts) Acts 10:21-27

I'm not really seeing anything here regarding the vision's interpretation. Maybe we should just give it up and make one up and then stuff our face with chili. I don't know, I get the feeling we will be rewarded if we trudge on. Yah would prefer it that way. After all, it is his right to conceal a matter and the honor of kings to seek it out. The only problem is, it's difficult finding anyone nowadays who will read a thing through to the end. I'm willing to bring up the standard and finish it if you are. To *you know*, see if there's a moral to the story after all.

<sup>28</sup> And he said unto them, Ye know how that it is an unlawful thing for a man that is a Yahudiym to keep company or come unto one of another nation; but Elohiym hath shewed me that I should not call any man common or unclean.

Ma'asiym (Acts) 10:28

Woah, horsey. Did Kepha just interpret the dream for us? I think so. Let's not jump the gun quite yet, but I'm pretty certain Kepha interpreted the dream for us. Yes, I reread it again. He *did*. He said Elohiym had shown him that he should not call any man common or unclean. Why did he leave out the part about the animals? Shouldn't Kepha tell them about the unclean animals being clean again? Kepha, why didn't you tell them about the animals? They're clean, right? RIGHT...!? There are a lot of unhappy Baptists standing around at the church picnic right now, preparing to hock a loogy at me downwind. What is going on? I thought the vision was about a cob salad and the bacon bap, not people. *Silly* Kepha. Can't interpret his own vision nearly as well as people with degrees and Seminary students.

You have to wonder if he corrects his own error later on. Let's keep reading in case that happens.

<sup>34</sup>Then Kepha opened his mouth, and said, Of a truth I perceive that Elohiym is no respecter of persons: <sup>35</sup>But in every nation he that fears him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with him.

Ma'asiym (Acts) 10:34-35

I cheated and skipped ahead several verses. It was to save paper. But as you can see, Kepha interpreted his vision *again*. If you're counting on your fingers, that's his *second* clarification, and they remain the same. He said Elohiym is no respecter of <del>pork</del>. Wait, scratch that. What I meant to say is *persons*. "Of a truth I perceive" is just as important. It's his way of letting us know what his analysis is, and that it is the Elohiym-given truth rather than a lie.

If Kepha were lying to us, he would say something to the goyim like: "I brought the sausages. Fire up the grill," thereby causing the Baptists to perform backflips and somersaults with a napkin clinging to their neck. 11 And the apostles and brethren that were in Yahudah heard that the Goyim had also received the word of Elohiym. <sup>2</sup> And when Kepha was come up to Yerushalayim, they that were of the circumcision contended with him, <sup>3</sup> Saying, Thou went to men uncircumcised, and did eat with them.

## Ma'asiym (Acts) 11:1-3

Now that I think about it, this would have been the perfect opportunity for Ya'aqov and the Yerushalayim group to add cutlets to their list of complaints. But they didn't. Read it again. Nowhere do they claim that Kepha was gnawing upon a club sandwich. Seems to me like what they were upset about is the fact that he ate among pagan men who had yet to cross over into the Avrahamic covenant by way of taking a knife to it. I could be wrong about that. <sup>4</sup> But Kepha rehearsed the matter from the beginning, and expounded it by order unto them, saving, 5 I was in the city of Yapho praying: and in a trance I saw a vision, A certain vessel descend, as it had been a great sheet, let down from heaven by four corners; and it came even to me: 6 Upon the which when I had fastened mine eyes, I considered, and saw four-footed beasts of the earth, and wild beasts, and creeping things, and fowls of the air. 7 And I heard a voice saying unto me, Arise, Kepha; slay and eat. 8 But I said, Not so, Adonai: for nothing common or unclean hath at any time entered into my mouth. 9 But the voice answered me again from heaven, What Elohiym hath cleansed, that call not thou common. 10 And this was done three times: and all were drawn up again into heaven. <sup>11</sup> And, behold, immediately there were three men already come unto the house where I was, sent from Qeycaryah unto me.

## Ma'asiym (Acts) 11:4-11

At what point during or any time after Kepha's explanation do you think the brothers Ya'aqov and Yehudah went out and ordered a Cubano sandwich with the Yerushalayim group? Or how about a McRib? McDonalds brings that one back from time to time. Kepha was hungry when the vision occurred, but it was to illustrate a point. He thought upon what the thrice vision might entail, and thought upon it some more, and then finally concluded, *rightfully*, that the meaning could be found in the three men. If only others would think about this with as much consideration as Kepha did. The vision was obvious to him and everyone else whom he told it to. I would have to be purposefully deceitful in order
